## Pee Wee Swine Open Show

**Pee Wee Swine Show:** July 20 following the Swine Show, check in at 10 am

**Release Time:** July 21 at 9 am unless animals are going on the livestock auction truck

### **Pee Wee Swine Department Rules**

- Exhibitors are responsible to read and comply with the General Rules.
- Exhibitors must be between 3 years old and completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade to compete in the Pee Wee Swine Open Show.
- Exhibitors must register their animals in FairEntry <https://floydcounty.fairentry.com> between May 16 and June 21 at 11:59 pm. If the exhibitor is a Clover Kid sign in with your 4HOnline information. If the exhibitor participated in the past, sign in with the information from the past. If the exhibitor is new to showing at the Floyd County Fair sign up by creating a new profile in FairEntry.
- Up to 2 pigs may be shown in the Pee Wee Swine Open Show.
- Animals cannot be shown in the 4-H and FFA Swine Show or be part of a sibling's current 4-H/FFA project.
- All Pee Wee Swine must have an EID tag. Tags will be available through the Floyd County Extension Office for purchase at \$3 each. Taggers will be available for checkout. If you need assistance tagging your pig(s) contact the superintendents.
- All swine are subject to a random urine test at the Floyd County Fair.
- **Pee Wee Swine superintendents reserve the right to refuse pigs to the show ring due to the pig being unfit to show including cleanliness of pens and aisles.**
- Classes will be split by fair entry weight. If an exhibitor has two animals in one class due to the fair entry weight, the exhibitor has the option to move one animal up into the next weight class if there is a heavier weight class above them.
- **Each exhibitor must have a Premise ID number. To register for a Premise ID, submit the Identification Number Application found at <https://iowaagriculture.gov/animal-disease-traceability>.**
- Exhibitors must use bagged woodchips or wood shavings in their pens at fair.
- Exhibitors are not allowed to use any waterers at fair that will create a mess in the pen or alley. Open troughs, barrels, rubber or tin devices are examples of waterers not allowed.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for:
  1. Knowing their stall number
  2. Pigs getting to and from the show arena
  3. Keeping their pens and aisle clean

- Pee Wee Swine are not eligible to be sold at the livestock auction but can be sold at market value at put on the auction truck.

### **Pig Experience**

Youth who would like to have the show experience but don't have a location to house their own pig can contact the volunteers below who are willing to work with families for the show experience. Youth will be expected to assist with care of the pig, such as feeding and washing, along with working with the pig to get comfortable showing the pig at the owner's location to prepare for showing at the county fair. Expectations would be determined through a discussion between the pig owner and youth/family.
